The priest:

Listen to the words of the Holy Gospel according to Luke

There was a lawyer who, to disconcert him, stood up and said to him, "Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" He replied, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself."

He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live." But the man was anxious to justify himself, and said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?"

Jesus replied, "A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jerico and fell into the hands of brigands; they took all he had, beat him and then made off, leaving him half dead. Now a priest happened to be travelling down the same road, but when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side.

In the same way a Levite who came to the place saw him and passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan traveller who came upon him was moved with compassion when he saw him. He went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. He then lifted him on to his own mount, carried him to the inn and looked after him.
